

THANK YOU for your lifesaving service. I am and will continue to encourage others to take advantage of your painless, non-invasive screening. Sincerely, Lloyd T., ND







CAROTID ARTERY DISEASE




Like coronary arteries, carotids can develop atherosclerosis, which is a build-up of plaque. It causes a decrease in blood flow to the brain and can lead to a stroke.

ABDOMINAL AORTIC ANEURYSM



An aneurysm is a ballooning in the wall of an artery. It can form in any artery in the body but the most common is in the abdomen. AAAs usually have no symptoms until rupture. The rupture can be fatal.
